Dish of the month Homemade banana and berry ice cream



Ingredients:

- 6 large, ripe bananas thickly sliced
- 200g mixed frozen berries
- 300g fat-free greek-style yoghurt
- 175g light condensed milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract

Method:

1. Freeze the sliced bananas in a freezerproof bag for 3–4 hours, until solid.
2. Whizz the frozen berries with half the yoghurt in a food processor until fairly smooth. Turn out of the processor and set aside.
3. Put the frozen bananas in the food processor with the condensed milk, vanilla and the remaining yoghurt and blend until smooth. Turn out into a wide bowl, and swirl through the berry mixture.
4. Spoon into a lidded freezerproof container and freeze for 3–4 hours, or until ready to serve.

Jingle Bugs:

Every Friday at Tiddlywinks, during term time, each room has the pleasure of engaging in Jingle Bugs with Nina.

Nina is an early years music practitioner and has been running her music programme, Jingle Bugs, at Tiddlywinks for over 2 years. She also runs fantastic glow in the dark disco parties (Glow Bug Parties) for children aged 4 to 8 years. On enquiry, Nina can also accommodate a Jingle Bugs party or a combination of both for younger children.

Nina offers Jingle Bug music classes, during term time on Wednesday mornings at the Colman Redland centre in Reigate and Thursday mornings at The Community Centre in Woodhatch. These classes are for children aged between 3 months and 5 years old. Nina also runs a community pop choir called Unison Choir - they're a fun, affordable and friendly choir who rehearse every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month at Redhill United Reformed Church. They support local charities and fundraisers through their live performances throughout the year. They're always looking for new members, and you're very welcome to try them out for free!

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
